

Tyler Policy on Alcoholic Beverages

General Policy Statement on Drug and Alcohol Use

As a unit of Temple University, Tyler School of Art is obligated to follow the official Drug and Alcohol Policy at Temple University. The full policy can be found at http://policies.temple.edu/getdoc.asp?policy_no=03.70.01

In summary, that policy says:

Temple University strictly prohibits the unlawful possession, use, consumption, distribution or manufacture of drugs and alcohol on University property, or as part of any University activity. A violation of this policy will subject the student to the range of sanctions, including, but not limited to, expulsion, as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

What Does That Mean?

This means that alcohol is not permitted at any event sponsored by, or even partially sponsored by Temple University and/or Tyler School of Art, **even if YOU pay for the alcohol.**

Alcohol is not permitted at any reception for undergraduate or graduate event or exhibition on or off campus. Alcohol is not permitted at any artist talk or guest lecture reception, even if the reception is held off campus. Alcohol is not permitted at any party or event where some Temple or Tyler money was used for any part of the event.

The bottom line: *if an event is connected with Temple or Tyler in any way, you cannot have alcohol. Period.*

Additional Restriction for GAF or Student Activity Money

General Activity Funds, or Student Activity Funds for student groups cannot be used to sponsor or partially sponsor an off-campus event for Temple students **where alcohol is served** (even if alcohol is purchased with non-GAF/personal funds). This means you cannot have an activity-money (whole or partially) funded event at a restaurant or other facility where alcohol is served, ***even if alcohol is not served at your event.***
